Organ Donation Education

April is Donate Life Month!

Organ donation education is the Nevada State President's Project for this administration. Education about organ donation is vital to dismiss myths that exist about this process and would assist those waiting for organs. This is an amazing opportunity to give the gift of life. The concept of giving a part of yourself to someone to make them whole and healthy is awe-inspiring. Given that there are over 100,000 people on the waiting list, the impact a single donor can make is immense. Every day 17 people die waiting for transplants, and nine people are added daily. Every deceased donor can save up to eight lives and enhance over 75 more. YOU can help.

By registering to become an organ donor you have the option to donate organs such as your heart, lungs, liver, kidneys, pancreas, and small bowel. These forms of donation can enhance or even save the life of someone in need. You can also donate tissue, eye, bone

marrow, blood stem cells or donate your body for research. Follow this link to register in your state to be a

donor: www.organdonor.gov/sign-up.

During this journey, our President has connected with Nevada Donor Network and we have learned that in the state of Nevada, the only transplant that you can receive is kidney. If you need any other type of transplant, you must travel elsewhere. Our president's husband needs a liver transplant and travels to California for medical services. This is the catalyst behind this project.

Our goal is to create an educational program model that can be used throughout the country. This education will save lives. Please join our journey to help give life!







Legislative Corner

To encourage participation in the democratic process, this monthly column aims to inform members about current legislation and programs that are germane to the GFWC Resolutions. It also highlights important actions of Congress and the White House, and provides follow-up information about GFWC Legislative Action Alerts.

April is federal appropriations time on Capitol Hill and a time for advocacy groups to communicate support for programs that serve their constituencies. Often, when members of Congress vote to cut a program, they say they did not hear from anyone back home that the program was important to them. GFWC prioritizes federal funding for our signature program, Domestic and Sexual Violence Awareness and Prevention, and programs affecting children, especially child abuse prevention and global vaccinations. Visit the Legislative Action

<u>Center</u> to take action on recent critically important issues including funding for global vaccinations and domestic violence shelters and rape crisis centers and programs supporting prevention and services for survivors. Members of Congress need to hear from GFWC. Your Voice Matters! Haven't yet joined the GFWC Legislative Action Center – It's not too late!

Today we salute a GFWC member and two GFWC clubs for their progress on the Scavenger Hunt. The Legislation/ Public Policy Club Connection Initiative is a GFWC Scavenger Hunt intended to encourage legislative advocacy on the local, state, and national level, while also raising awareness of GFWC as an organization. The first Legislative Super Star is Kandace Hill, a member of GFWC of Holden Beach (NC). She has completed six of the nine items on the list and hopes to tackle the remaining three this year.

Two clubs submitted Scavenger Hunt forms, GFWC of Holden Beach (NC) and GFWC Paradise Valley Junior Woman's Club (AZ). Both clubs took time to match their club projects to a GFWC resolution resulting in double digit points. Both clubs took action on Legislative Action Center alerts and received responses from their elected officials. Is your club or state federation on the hunt? A search of the #GFWCAdvocacy on social media shows lots of clubs and states are scoring points with visits to their state capitals, proclamations for Advocates for Children week, and photos with elected officials. Keep up the good work, as Together We Advocate for Those in Need.
