GFWC: A Collective Voice

2025 Women's History Month Celebration









The 2025 GFWC Women's History Month celebration welcomed GFWC members and the public into the almost 150-year-old drawing room of 1734 N Street yesterday. Rebecca Grawl, a speaker from women-owned and operated "A Tour of Her Own", gave the audience a glimpse into the lives of women who walked the streets of Dupont Circle 100 years ago. Women like Alice Roosevelt Longworth, President Theodore Roosevelt's daughter, resided in Dupont Circle and was known as the "People's Princess."

Women's History & Resource Center Librarian Joanna Church shared insightful stories of women who lived on the property before and after GFWC purchased 1734 N ST, the first of three rowhouses in 1922. She shared stories of residents like Dr. Julia Minerva Green, a homeopathic doctor who lived and worked in 1738, one of our three rowhouses, during the 1910s.

The President's Special Assistants provided a delightful array of homemade appetizers and desserts for guests to enjoy. Such dedication is essential to making events like this a special experience for all attendees.

Guests were encouraged to tour GFWC Headquarters and appreciate the newly renovated Women's History and Resource Center Library. The updates to spaces like these help facilitate research and archival processes.

Thank you to all who joined us, we are honored to celebrate the contributions of women past and present.



GFWC Visits Capitol Hill

GFWC International President Suellen Brazil met with U.S. Senator Katie Britt of Alabama who is a member of the Appropriations Committee and the Judiciary Committee. President Brazil emphasized the importance of the GFWC Signature Program, which focuses on raising awareness and preventing domestic and sexual violence. Her comments highlighted the program's critical role in addressing these pressing societal issues.

Senator Britt is in a key position to help secure funding for domestic violence shelters, rape crisis centers, services for survivors, and sexual assault prevention and education. GFWC members are aware that their communities rely on prevention programs, available 24-hour hotlines, shelters, safe housing for survivors and their families, counseling, and trauma-informed training for law enforcement.

GFWC Secretary Dr. Susan Gettys met with U.S. Senator Eric Schmitt from Missouri. They discussed the GFWC Signature Program: Domestic and Sexual Violence Awareness and Prevention and protecting children online from sexual predators. Dr. Gettys thanked the Senator for his work on the rape kit backlog when he was Attorney General. Now he serves on congressional committees with jurisdiction over issues important to GFWC.
